Breakfast Cookies

(makes approx 6 dozen cookies, depending on how much dough you eat!) 1/2 cup honey 3/4 cup brown sugar 3/4 cup coconut oil 2 eggs

2 tsp vanilla

- 1/2 cup ground flax seed
- 1 1/2 cup flour (I used all purpose)
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 cups oats (I used old-fashioned)

1/4 EACH dried cranberries, dark chocolate chips, sesame seeds, chopped nuts**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line baking sheets with parchment or wax paper.

In a large mixing bowl, combine honey, sugar and oil blend well. Beat in eggs

and vanilla. Add remaining ingredients and mix until just, but well, combined.

Drop approximately 1 tablespoon of batter onto baking sheets and bake for

10 minutes, or until set and slightly browned on the edges. Cool on a rack.
