

Bonney Lake Police Department TRAFFIC EMPHASIS OF THE MONTH July, 2013 Speeding/Aggressive Driving "Slow Down or Pay Up"

During the month of July 2013, Officers will be conducting a special traffic enforcement emphasis looking for aggressive drivers and speeding vehicles.

- The U.S. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) defines aggressive driving as a progression of unlawful driving actions such as:
- Speeding exceeding the posted limit or driving too fast for conditions
- Excessive lane changing changing lanes without reasonable cause
- Improper passing failing to signal intent, using an emergency lane to pass, or passing on the shoulder, cutting into another car's path
- Tailgating driving near the back of another's car at too close of a range.

Other Speeding Facts:

- Driving faster than the speed limit or too fast for conditions accounts for more than a third of all deadly crashes in Washington.
- Speed Kills— On Washington roadways, there were 1,045 speeding involved fatal crashes between 2004 and 2008. These crashes resulted in a total of 1,166 deaths, which is an average of 233 per year. This accounts for approximately 40% of all traffic deaths during the five year period.
- Nearly one-third (347 of 1,166; 29.8%) of all speeding-related deaths occurred from July through September. The fewest deaths occurred during the winter months, from December through February.

How do Burglars get in?

•If you have ever locked yourself out of the house, you may have found yourself walking around the exterior of your home looking for the easiest way in. Burglars do the same thing. They look at your doors and windows, looking for easy passage. This could be one that is open or unlocked, or because of its design or age one that is easy to bypass its locks. Or if they are brazen, (and this happens a lot) they just kick down a door or smash a window.

•Hollow core doors should not be used for exterior doors. Upgrade to a solid wood or steel door. Entry doors can be pried or kicked. Every door should be secured with a single-cylinder deadbolt lock. A single cylinder lock has a turn lever on the inside of the door and requires a key on the outside. City code does not allow the use of double cylinder locks. Double cylinder locks require a key on the inside and on the outside. The deadbolt should have at least a one inch throw. A security strike plate with four inch screws is recommended. A standard strike plate is secured with only two quarter inch long screws while a security strike plate has four, four inch long screws. Make sure all exterior doors have a deadbolt.

•Overhead garage doors are usually a problem only when they are left open. It only takes a few seconds for a burglar to walk in off the street and take some valuable item from your garage. Keep your overhead door closed at all times. If you see your neighbor's overhead garage door open, call and let them know.

*Sliding glass doors are often targeted. Do not trust the lock that comes with the door. There are several different styles of locks that offer better protection. Ones that prevent the door from being lifted up out of the track as well as sliding open are the ones to get. A broom handle can be cut and laid down on the inside of the track to help hold the door closed, but though this may improve your security a little, installing an additional lock preventing the door from being lifted up over the track is still recommended. Again the problem with most windows is that they are left open or they are closed but unlocked. If possible keep your windows closed and locked, especially if they are low to the ground. Window screens do not offer any security. They are often removed, torn or cut. Once the screen on a window is removed the glass can easily be opened. If you must keep your window open while you are asleep, or occupied in another area of the house select a lock that will allow you to secure your window when it is partially opened. Most adults cannot get their head through an opening of six inches or less. Most newer windows come with a partial open-window security position. They work pretty good if used correctly, but Note: A window opened wider than this factory selected secured position can be easily lifted from the track. Try it yourself and see. In fact that's how you take the window out for cleaning. Burglars know this and look for such opportunities, especially in the hot summer months when people leave windows "cracked". Many intruders that enter your house while you are asleep or occupied enter quietly in this way, buy just lifting out a window.

•Get into a habit of locking all your doors and windows when you leave, even if you plan only to be gone for a short time.

•If you have a security system Arm it. Many people think it's a bother and rely on that little sign in the yard to scare away potential buglers. But buglers casing your house as you leave have ears and they listen for the sound of the security system being set.
